## Life's Pathway

Her essence was like the fragrance of a rose that will continue to envelop those whom she loved perpetually.

The oldest of two children, Bertha Arnita Norris was born on May 7, 1940, to Mr. and Mrs. Clyde and Eva Mae Taylor Norris, in the same Bottom Creekers area where the family continues to reside to this day. Surrounded by generations of family, she was reared in a home of love in a hands-on neighborhood where everybody knew everybody, and most were related to each other in some way. Her formal education was secured through the Duval County schools, namely Darnell Cookman and Moncrief Elementary, Isaiah Blocker Junior High, and New Stanton Senior High.

Bertha received Christ as her Savior at the age of ten under the pastorate of Rev. B.W. Williams, was baptized in Gillis Lake, and began her walk with God in Mt. Bethel Baptist Church, serving Him for decades in many capacities until her health failed. Through the years, Snooky or Bert, as she was lovingly called, served with the Culinary Ministry, Usher Board #4, the Deaconess Board, the Missionary Society, the SAT Joylistic Voices Support Team, as Secretary for the first Building Fund Committee, as Director for the Sunshine Band and Red Circle Girls, sang in Choir #1/the Mass Choir. She loved her Pastor and loved her church, especially District #7. Although not officially, she was considered one of the Mothers of the church. Other activities included Voting Precinct worker; house sitter for Rev. and Sis. S. A. Thomas; Volunteer Caregiver, Cathedral Foundation; and provider of transportation for neighbors.

Employed as a chef with the Pic-N-Save Corporation, she retired after 15 years of faithful service.

Young Bertha met the love of her life, General Hubert Monroe, and they were wed October 6, 1956. The marriage was blessed with seven children, five girls and two boys. Their home was always a haven for the neighborhood, especially the young

people. The couple celebrated their Diamond Anniversary on October 1, 2016, one week prior to her homegoing.

On Friday, October 8, 2016, God called His servant home, where the wicked cease from troubling and the weary are at rest. She was preceded in death by her parents, Clyde Norris and Eva Norris Gallon; and her brother, Vander Kenneth Norris.
