Reflections of Life Brother Phillip G. Adams



Brother Phillip G. Adams was born December 8, 1922, in Jacksonville, Florida, to Mr. and Mrs. Raymond and Nora Posey Adams. Reared in the Sandy Spur Hill neighborhood of Moncrief Springs (The Bottom), he attended the local public school in Mt. Bethel Missionary Baptist Church. The church served this community as a school, community meetinghouse and sanctuary of worship. He accepted Jehovah and was baptized in the faith. Brother Adams enlisted in the United States Army in 1941 and was honorably discharged. Later, he became employed with the Downtown Oldsmobile Company, retiring after many years of dedicated service. The "Bottom" was considered country until Jacksonville and the rest of Duval County were consolidated. Wild game was plentiful, and he was a skillful hunter, providing for his family whatever the kill of the day was – rabbit, >coon, gopher, wild hog, opossum or squirrel.
