Willie Robinson, Sr. was born in Bainbridge/Fitzgerald, South Carolina, to Jessie and Meta Robinson on April 23, 1922. Willie (Grandpa) made a peaceful transition from earthly labor to heavenly rest on Wednesday, January 12, 2022, at the Community Hospice of Baptist Medical Center.


Willie grew up on the Gullah Geechee Islands of South Carolina. He later moved to Jacksonville, Florida, where he began his military career in the Army as a truck driver. During his tenure, he served in World War II and the Korean War and was later recognized on Veterans Day and Pearl Harbor Day by Channel WJXT for his service. Upon his honorable discharge from the military, he had a problem finding civilian employment in trucking. He became a banker for the Beaver Street Building, Frito-Lay Inc. and Florida Steel Corp. where he retired. His later years were spent serving as a pastor for the Jacksonville Job Corp Center.

Willie Robinson, Sr. was a member of Mt. Bethel Missionary Baptist Church, District #10. He loved God and often he found purpose and talking to Him on the behalf of others.

He loved fishing, especially with his great grandsons and his greatest joy was playing with his great great grandchildren. He was known as "Grandpa" to his grand and "Uncle Brother" to all of his nieces, nephews and friends.

Willie leaves his memories to be cherished by his two sons, Willie Robinson, Jr. of Fayetteville, NC, and Arthur Robinson (Letha) of Frederickburg, VA; his brother, William H.
